Internet Service Providers (ISP)

The concept of an ISP emerged in the 1990s. Prior to that, access to the Internet was limited primarily to government and academia, with a small amount of crossover with "online services" like CompuServe, Prodigy, and America Online.

The ISP, short for 'Internet Service Provider', is the company that connects your personal computer, notebook, netbook, mobile device, game station, etc. to the Internet. Another name for ISP is IAP, or Internet Access Provider.

Early ISPs started on a very small scale using "dialup modems" to serve dozens or possibly hundreds of customers. They were notoriously slow, particularly when it came to multimedia applications like the World Wide Web. Eventually, Internet service became an entity that was much more versatile and powerful than dialup modems could handle, using DSL, cable
